## Thank you for being our Members

Firstly, we thank each and every one of you who stayed with us during this most horrid of years. We couldn't have done what we've done without the membership; without you. We want to provide an avenue of thanks for your loyalty by giving you a reduction in your fees should you wish to take us up on that. Our treasurer will explain more in his report. The Club, though, will provide you with two fee payment options this year for you to choose from. One set of fees based on a full upfront payment, the other set of fees based on a Direct Debit scheme. The DD scheme is a division of the full payment, and we hope that should it be a few pence over or under, folk will bear with us.

# Who, how many and how old are we, these days?

We started the year with around 95 members. This is an excellent number, having finished the year with around 134. We often lose several people at the end of a year, for all sorts of reasons. As I write this ditty, we are fast approaching the close of this year. Currently we are at, or near, 170 members. We are the largest Archery Club in Norfolk and one of the biggest in the Region. Our youngest Archer is six and our oldest is 81. We have a huge contingent of kids at our Club and a massive 30% of members are women. The average age of our Archers is now just under 40. This means we are getting younger and I'm a fan of that.

#### Making Plans for our Future

During the year a group of the Club, members willing to put their efforts to supporting the Club, met to work on a Club Development Plan. As one of our trusted members said, if you don't have a plan any route will take you to where you are going. That group has already proved very useful. The group included in the Development Plan some enhanced facilities, to ensure that our Archery Family can meet and have their most basic needs met.

We are not stopping with the basics. We continue to make plans to develop the Club for the benefit of our Members, future members and guest archers from other clubs. With the work of your committee, we'll be ensuring you our Members needs are met. We will continue to listen to your views that come to us via social media, email and of course through the many chats we all have at Club.

#### Bog-tastic

The Archer's Rest is now fully functioning. I'm very happy to let you know that I bid for and achieved a £10k grant from Sport England for our Posh Potty that now rests quietly in the corner of our plot. Along with that, we are extending the side of the Shooting Shed at some stage over late Summer, watch this space. Once the extended shed is up and running, we'll be discussing our use of it, how we can make it equitable for all those who want to shelter and the more hardy among you.

## Making Archery Accessible

We continue to be a "No Cash" club, with all payments heading directly to the bank from your bank. We are very grateful for this and will continue to use these systems in future. As for Direct Debit Payments, these will also continue, and we ask you to adopt these if you wish.

#### Treasurer's Report


This has been a challenging year for everyone, with the impact of Covid 19 leading to multiple lockdowns, suspension of shooting, financial, physical, and emotional stresses on everyone.

The club is in a strong position financially with a net balance of over £34k in our accounts. The total financial balance of the club has increased by just over £6.8K in the last 12 months. However, there is a caveat in that we have not expended any funds to support the indoor shooting sessions at Easton College in 2021, between September and December this equates to an expenditure of £4371, we did receive a refund of £939.70. The cost to provide the Monday, Wednesday and Saturday sessions is around £1217 per calendar month.

Grants and donations since Sept 2020 have brought us just over £12.5K, these have been obtained from several sources due to the hard work and persistence of the Chairman, we have been supported by Archery GB, South Norfolk District Council, Norfolk Archery Association, National Lottery, and several personal donations. The Lottery funding of £9975 went a long way towards the installation of the Eco Toilet for the benefit of all our membership, the clubs' savings funds being used to complete the purchase and installation.


We have transferred £7212.38 from WA's day to day current account to our savings account during the year.

The income and outgoings of the club are illustrated graphically below



The largest income stream by far is from our membership with approx 2/3 of the club paying in 1 lump sum, the remaining paying via one of the 2 ARCs schemes.

We currently have 174 members in the club which considering the upheaval of the last 18 months is a good sign of a growing community club. There were concerns that we may have lost some members due to the impact of Covid, but is has been heartening to see archers at the club, out and shooting, new and old faces.



Outgoings are dominated by the £13k costs of the eco toilet project, taking this out as a one-off cost, the primary outgoings are AGB membership, closely followed by the hire of Easton College for the indoor season. The committee continue to look for alternative shooting solutions to provide our members with the facility to continue archery in the darker winter months.
